Swiss-Canadian Teo Gheorghiu made his concert debut at the Tonhalle Hall in Zurich aged 12.

He went on to win the first prizes in the San Marino International Piano Competition and Liszt Competition in Weimar. He was awarded the coveted Beethovenring at the Beethovenfest Bonn.

In 2006, he starred in the title role of Fredi Murer's Vitus opposite Bruno Ganz. Telling the story of a young piano prodigy. The film has received numerous awards and as a result Teo has performed at the Istanbul, Tribeca (New York) and Locarno Film Festivals

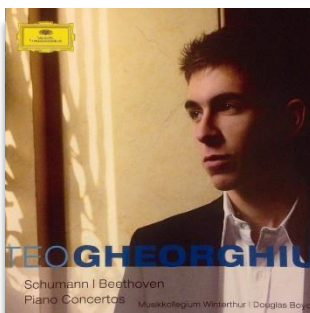

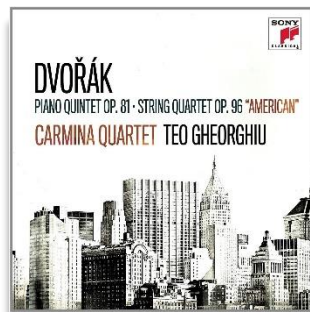
